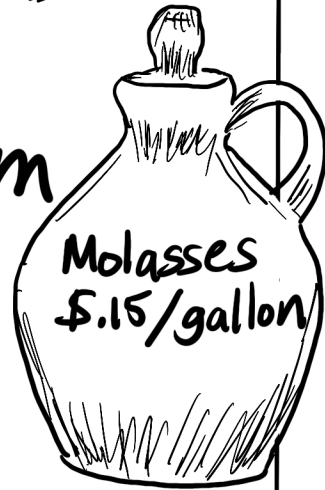

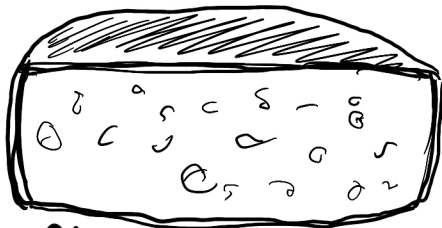
Laurel was incorporated in 1870. During that time, residents purchased food from various grocers and dry good stores in the town.

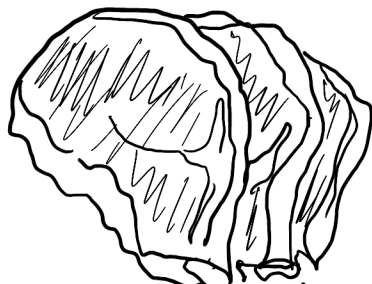

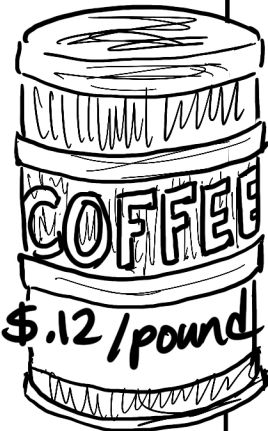
