Adults should supervise children with cutting and assembling.

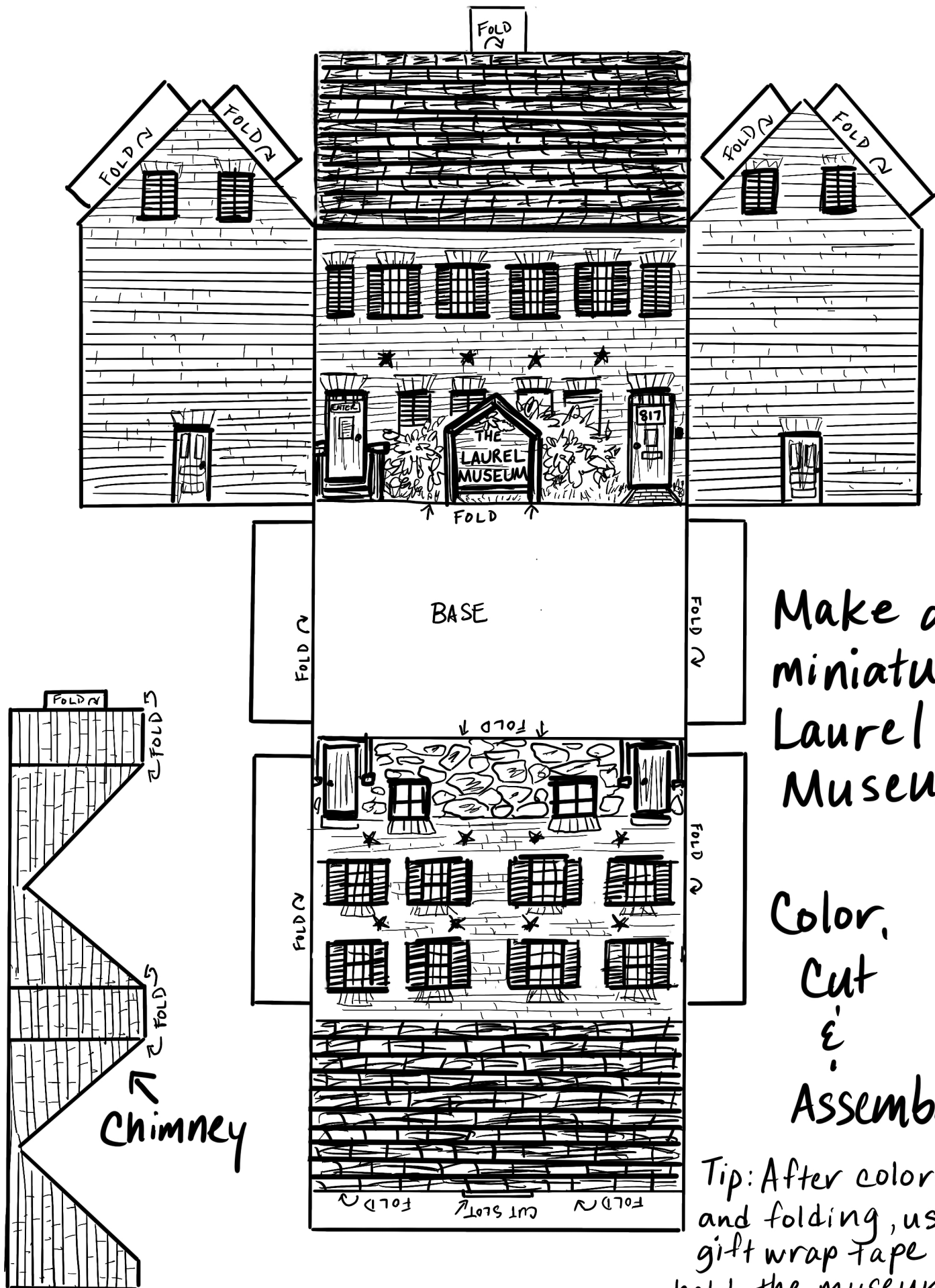
