Were Maryland men and others needlessly sacrificed during WW1's final days? The Meuse-Argonne is considered to be the largest and costliest battle that American troops have ever fought. Running for 47 days from September 26 - November 11, the offensive wounded 96,000 and cost 26,000 American lives, including three from Laurel.

Presenters from the Laurel Historical Society will take you through the battle to the Armistice that ended the war on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month - November 11, 1918.
